



SUMMER READING NEWSLETTER FOR KEY STAGE 3 & 4

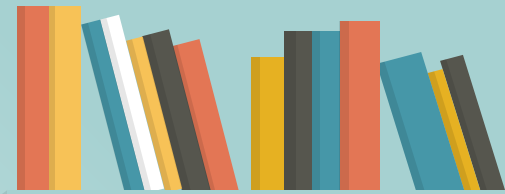
As the end of the academic year approaches, you and your child will no doubt be planning what to do over the summer. Reading benefits many areas of education and life. In addition to the obvious benefits on reading comprehension and attainment, it also impacts upon:

- Knowledge and understanding of the world and other people
- Achievement in other subjects, including maths

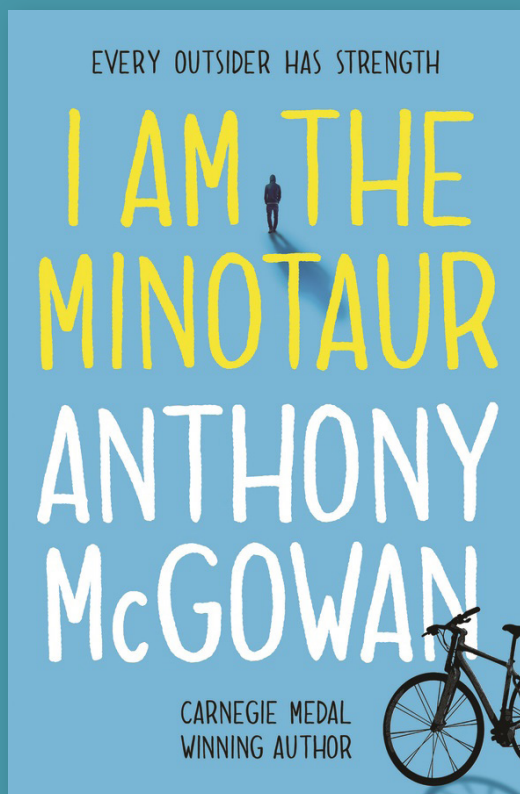

TANYA LANDMAN

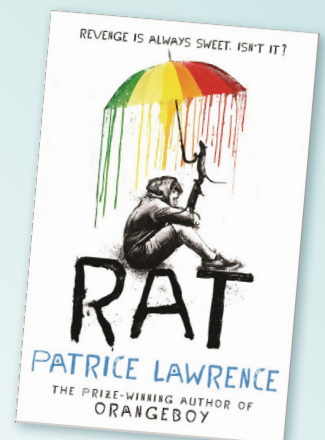

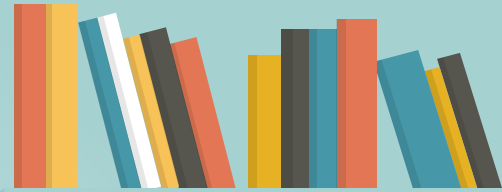


Rat

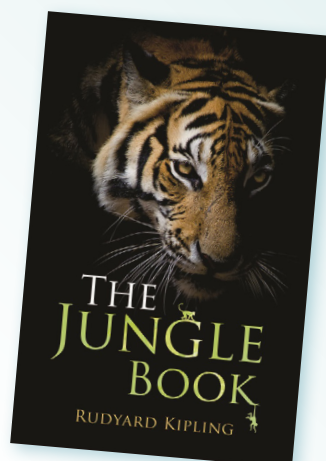

RUDYARD KIPLING

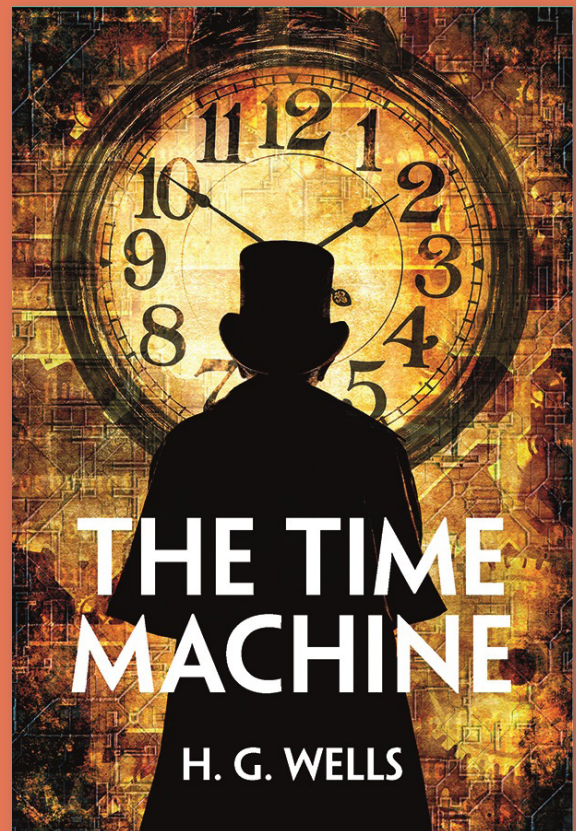
