- Knowledge and understanding of the world and other people
- Achievement in other subjects, including maths
- Empathy and understanding of emotions
- Development of our sense of 'self' and identity

To help you and your child select some books to read this summer, we have collated a range of books for you to explore which may help with their transition, or which your child may really enjoy immersing themselves in over the summer holiday. Please do research the books before selecting them to ensure that they are appropriate for your child.

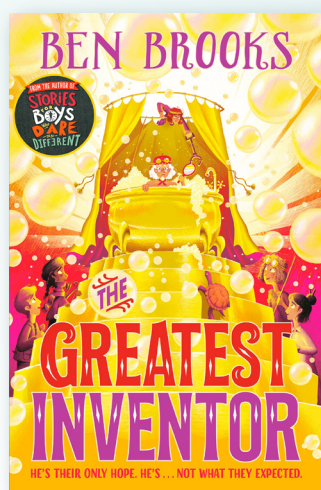


Black Brother, Black Brother

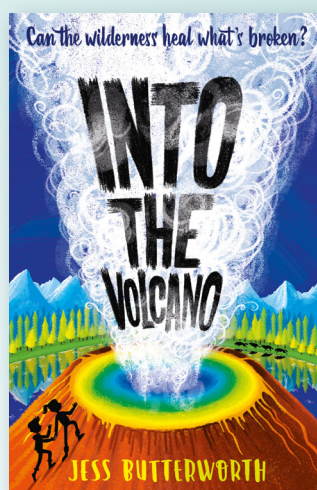


The Greatest Inventor BEN BROOKS

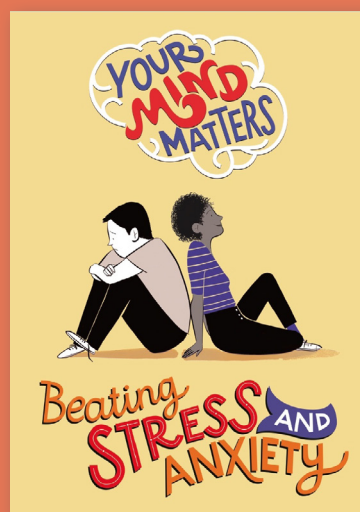


Your Mind Matters: Beating Stress and Anxiety

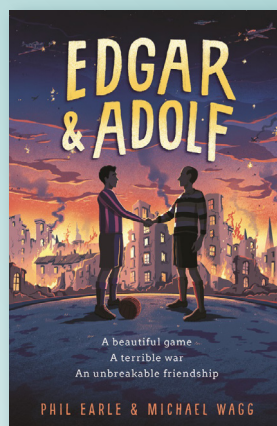

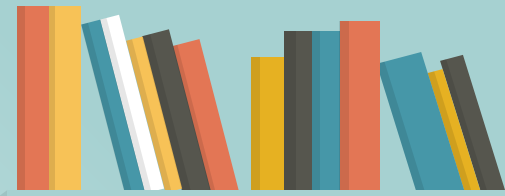
When the Sky Falls
