

## Method marking

- Get some magnesium and put it in concentrated hydrochloric acid.
   Measure the time taken for the magnesium to finish reacting.
- Get some more magnesium and put that in less concentrated acid and measure how long that takes to finish reacting

Tier 2 (3 marks).

Method has most
steps but no
controls

When discussing whether the concentration affects rate of reaction you will need to make sure that you control the temperature and the surface area of the magnesium. This is because they will affect the number of collisions between the reactants.


When you have collected the results you need to repeat the experiment, check for anomalies and calculate a mean aver.

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
